

# W.B. Saul High School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, <u>W.B. #### **Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED**

**W.B. Saul High School** will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

- All school information is distributed through our students, robo-calls and SIS Messenger emails and texts, and available in our front office.
- Each year we try to improve the process of collecting parent feedback via our paper surveys provided by our Title I office and also laptops for parent completion of the online survey. This information helps us determine the best time to hold meetings for our parents.

- This year we will provide transportation for our parents to participate in college tours with their students.
- We make our best efforts to make sure all information is understandable and in parent friendly language. If for any reason we need to get translations we can submit through the School District of Philadelphia's Family and Community Engagement office.

- During the Winter, we hold a Winter Title I meeting to discuss and receive feedback from parents regarding our School Level Budget and School Level Plan. We also ask for input on the 1% set aside alloted from the School's Title I budget.
- This year, we held a meeting on January 10, 2019 for parents to give feedback on the school plan, budget and Title I 1% set aside.
- Parents will be invited to a Title I meeting in the Spring to review the budget with the school leadership and provide input about the priorities for the parental engagement set-aside funds.

<u>W.B. - We hold our annual Title I meeting during Back to School Night every year in the Fall. School leadership will discuss: Title I requirements, curriculum, academic standards and assessments, monitoring your child's progress, the schoolwide plan, and working with educators.
- Parent-Teacher conferences provide an opportunity for discussion related to individual academic achievement.
- We will introduce the Parent Portal and assist parents in setting up accounts online to be able to access their child's grades and attendance information at Back to School Night. This effort will be led by our TTL, Ms. Anger and also support from the FACE office.

## Section H: BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

<u>W.B. Saul High School</u> will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:
